2019 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The AGM will mark the 4th anniversary of the commencement of my role as President of SSWA and it has once again given me great pride to represent you all at various forums and events. Our association has signed a five-year funding agreement with the Education Department which has been a tremendous achievement for all concerned. Domestically 2019 saw approximately 90,000 students accessing our Champion School's events in 20 different sports involving both Primary and Secondary school students. These students were supervised, coached and mentored by over 6000 volunteer teachers. At the Interstate level, 719 students attended National Championships across Australia. These students were coached and managed by over 100 passionate and professional staff. We will continue to strive toward our mission of "Providing Quality Sporting Opportunities to students in Western Australian schools". Thank you to you all for playing your part in helping us to achieve that ambition once again.

THE INTERSTATE SCENE

SSWA hosted three School Sport Australia (SSA) National Championships this year and as usual the feedback from the visiting states and territories was very positive. We pride ourselves on conducting first class National Championships here in Western Australia and the staff involved should be proud of their efforts on our behalf.

Our SSA hostings in 2019 began with the 12&U Australian Football competition hosted in Mandurah in August. The championship director was Mr Peter Della-Vedova who, along with his organising committee, did a tremendous job especially given the very wet start to the event. Peter is a long-time volunteer with our association and is also the outgoing National Sports Advisor for Australian Football.

The second hosting was the 18&U Golf, held in late August. This event was also hosted in Mandurah using The Cut, Mandurah Country Club and also Meadow Springs Golf Clubs. The championship director was Lynda Merritt who also works in the office for SSWA. Our final hosting was the 12&U Tennis held at Alexander Park Tennis Club. This event hosted in mid-October was directed by Robyn Brierley, also from the SSWA office. All three events were tremendously well conducted. Our thanks go to the Convenors and Championship Directors for the professionalism and passion they bring to these events on our behalf. With these hostings we have developed some wonderful relationships with local councils and clubs who have been of great assistance.

I felt that 2018 was going to be a difficult year to eclipse in terms of our on field success, however, we have once again performed well given the obvious disadvantage of our small population compared to a number of other states. Bronze medals were secured by no less than 11 teams namely our, 12&U AFL Boys, 15&U AFL Boys, 15&U AFL Girls, Cross Country, 12&U Football Girls, 18&U Football Girls, 12&U Girls Hockey, 12&U Netball, Girls Softball, 18&U Tennis and the Triathlon Team. The 12&U Hockey Boys team, Volleyball Girls team and the Golf Boys 18&U team all played magnificently to bring home a gold medal. A big congratulations to all the members of those successful teams and of course all those who represented Western Australia in team and individual events.

LOCALLY

The Senior High Schools Country Week (SHSCW) and its smaller cousin the District High Schools Country Week (DHSCW) carnivals continue to provide sporting and cultural opportunities for our more remote students and staff. They are flagship events on the SSWA calendar and have been for more than 90 years in regards to the SHSCW. There were 3,600 students involved in the SHSCW managed by 400 staff and 900 students in the DHSCW wonderfully looked after by 100 staff. How wonderful it is to see schools coming from as far afield as Derby and Christmas Island taking part in a week of sporting and cultural activities.

CONCLUSION

On your behalf, throughout the year, I had the privilege of attending the School Sport Australia Conference in Darwin, the SSWA Life Member's Function, the volunteers function at the AFLW game at Fremantle Oval, all three National Championships, the SSWA Presentation Evening and our own residential conference. On behalf of the board of School Sport WA I would like to sincerely thank the SSWA office staff consisting of Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Christine Sheen, Sally Foot, Tania Hardie and Tamara Wright who, very ably led by Peter Smith, have done a wonderful job of conducting business for the last twelve months. My thanks also go to my fellow board members who have willingly given their time for the benefit of students within our schools. A particular thank you to my two Vice Presidents, Alex McLennan (Primary) and Kelvin Browner (Secondary) who filled in for me on occasions this year. Also to the finance committee of Clayton Bird, Narelle Scott and Lorraine Feddema headed by treasurer Wayne Baseden who have done wonders this year to make sure we continue on a sound financial pathway.

I look forward with enthusiasm to the continued growth of our association into 2020 and beyond. We continue to expand the number of students accessing our competitions and therefore the number of enthusiastic volunteers who look after them. Thank you to all of you who have contributed in some way to the provision of quality sporting opportunities for Western Australian school children.

2019 SCHOOL SPORT MANAGER'S REPORT

School Sport WA has had another exceptional year. Over 600 students have been selected to represent their state in School Sport Australia[SSA] Championships throughout Australia. 14 of the 32 teams that participated in the SSA Championships returned with medals. 29 students were selected in All Australian teams during the year. SSWA appointed more than 110 team officials to select, prepare and travel with our teams to these Championships.

SSWA hosted three School Sport Australia National Championships in 2019. In August the SSA Australian Football 12 years and Under Championship was hosted at Rushton Park in Mandurah. The National SSA 18yrs and Under Golf Championships were also held in Mandurah in late August. These were held at the Mandurah Country Club, Meadow Springs Golf Club and The Cut Golf Course. The 12 years and Under Bruce Cup Tennis Championships were hosted at Alexander Park Tennis Club in October. Thank you to all of the Convenors and Championship Directors for their work in ensuring the success of the championships. All of the championships were extremely successful and showcased our wonderful state and our expertise in hosting National Championships.

Our Champion Schools program continues to flourish with over 90,000 students involved in our interschool sport programs. Thanks go to our volunteer Sport Coordinators who provide valuable assistance in the running of these programs.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2019. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts.

SSWA has successfully negotiated a 5-year funding agreement with the Education Department from July 2019 through until June 2024.

I would once again like to thank the diligent SSWA office staff - Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Christine Sheen, Sally Foot, Tamara Wright, Courtney Hill and Tania Hardie for their outstanding commitment to SSWA throughout the year.

The work of these volunteers does not go unnoticed, and I am sure that parents of students across all educational sectors in Western Australia are very appreciative for the opportunities afforded their children.

The participation of students within our Champion Schools and Junior Interschool competitions has continued to be strong. Student participation in our programs is a direct result of the hard work put in by teachers across the state to coach and manage these teams, in their own time, after school and I would like to extend my thanks and congratulations to the teachers involved. Your dedication to enriching the sporting lives of your students is to be commended.

Secondary interschool sport offerings continue to grow and covered over 40 events in 2019 including the popular introduction of 3x3 Basketball. Congratulations to the winners of the 2019 McMahon Shield which acknowledges schools who participate and perform well across a number of secondary Champion Schools events. Tier 1 (for schools over 1200 population) winner was Willetton SHS and close second was Shenton College. Tier 2 (student population under 1200) was won by Darling Range Sports College and runner-up was John Forrest Secondary College.

On behalf of staff, students and parents across the state of Western Australia, I would like to take the opportunity to thank and congratulate the hard-working staff in the School Sport Office under the astute guidance of Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley and Lynda Merritt for coordinating the seemingly endless events covering Primary and Secondary sport, Country Weeks, National Championships (both at home and away) and International tour participation. Without their tireless work, the students of Western Australia would be lacking in quality sporting opportunities.

Two significant events on the SSWA calendar are Country Week and District High Schools Country week. The turnout of students from schools across our vast state and from island areas such as Christmas Island shows that the level of commitment from our teachers is not just confined to the metropolitan area. Congratulations to every staff member, student and parent who undertook the many hours or fundraising, travel and practice to make sure that these Country Week events were a success and a highlight of the sporting calendar for SSWA and the Department of Education.


