2020 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The AGM will mark the 5th anniversary of the commencement of my role as President of SSWA and it has once again given me great pride to represent you all at various forums and events. Whilst it probably goes without saying that Covid-19 has had an enormous impact on this year's activities there have been nevertheless quite a number of positives over the last twelve months. I would like to outline those positives here in the report as we will continue to strive toward our mission of "Providing Quality Sporting Opportunities to students in Western Australian schools". Thank you to all who have played their part in helping us to achieve that ambition once again.

Champion Schools:

In the absence of sporting activity in term two, quite a large number of our sport committee's and coordinators had to think outside the box a little and look at the re-structuring of our offerings. I would like to thank all involved for ensuring that students still had the opportunity to participate and represent their schools in a worthwhile competition. Also on the positive side we had record numbers of athletes participate in the 2020 Primary X-Country, Triathlon and Volleyball in the District High Schools Carnival.

The Interstate Scene:

Early in the year School Sport Australia had to make the unenviable decision to cancel the Interstate Programs for 2020. As it turned out this was a wise decision as state borders were ultimately closed preventing interstate travel. School Sport W.A. for its part has rolled over all coaching and management positions into 2021. School Sport Australia have likewise retained the interstate hosting roster as it was planned in 2020 and rolled it into 2021. Time will tell if the interstate program will be available to students in 2021. As an organisation we feel for the students who have missed out on the opportunity to represent their state and hope to see the program re instituted as soon as is possible.

The Office:

The School Sport W.A. office staff have had a busy year. A move was made from our long time home at Head Office in Royal St to our new home at Tuart College. Our new home has provided us with a number of benefits including more office space, a dedicated meeting room and the ability to have our store room on site. Our staff have also taken the opportunity to work extensively on our new website and also a new payment system, all which have taken many hours of intense work.

New Initiatives:

Over the course of the last twelve months a number of new initiatives have been trialled. Electronic Timing was used for the first time in the Primary Triathlon. On line results were trialled for the first time in our Basketball and Volleyball Competitions and will definitely be expanded in 2021. The twilight Primary School Track and Field event was also well received and will likely continue.

Conclusion:

On behalf of the board of School Sport WA I would like to sincerely thank the SSWA office staff consisting of Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Christine Sheen, Sally Foot, Tania Hardie and Tamara Wright who, very ably led by Peter Smith, have done a wonderful job of conducting business, often in difficult circumstances, for the last twelve months. My thanks also go to my fellow board members who have willingly given their time for the benefit of students within our schools. A particular thank you to my two Vice Presidents, Alex McLennan (Primary) and Kelvin Browner (Secondary) who have done a wonderful job and filled in for me on occasions this year as they have done in previous years. Also thank you to the finance committee of Clayton Bird, Narelle Scott and Lorraine Feddema headed by treasurer Wayne Baseden who have done wonders this year to make sure we continue on a sound financial pathway.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the support of the Department of Education in this difficult time. The continued assistance given with the grant and the financial certainty that has come with it has enabled us to work with surety and enabled us to put ourselves in a strong fiscal position for the years to come.

As you can see, whilst we have had our fair share of disappointments in 2020, it has also provided us with significant opportunities which have been acted on for the improvement of our organisation in the longer term. There has also been significant work completed on our new constitution, not exciting work, but certainly important and beneficial.

I look forward with enthusiasm to the continued growth of our association into 2021 and beyond. We will continue to expand the number of students accessing our competitions and therefore will need the number of enthusiastic volunteers who look after them to also continue to grow. Thank you to all of you who have contributed in some way to the provision of quality sporting opportunities for Western Australian school children in 2020.

School Sport WA has had an extraordinary year. Early in the year things were well on track with event planning and interstate teams were selected for the teams travelling to School Sport Australia Championships. When Covid-19 struck in March all events and travel were suspended.

School Sport Australia cancelled all National School Championships for the whole year. We were able to resume interschool sport at the start of Term 3.

Senior High Schools Country Week was unfortunately cancelled in 2020. Luckily, District High Schools Country Week was able to go ahead in September. Although numbers of schools and participants at DHS Country Week was down on 2019 numbers the event was very successful.

SSWA was due to host three SSA Championships in 2020 that did not go ahead – 17/U Softball, Pizzey Cup Tennis and 12/U Rugby League. SSWA was also due to host the SSA Conference in November 2020 which did not proceed.

Although our interschool sport numbers did not return to pre-Covid levels, indications are that SSWA will bounce back in 2021. Thanks go to our volunteer Sport Coordinators who provide valuable assistance in the running of these programs.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2020. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts during difficult times.

I would once again like to thank the hard working SSWA office staff - Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Christine Sheen, Sally Foot, Tamara Wright and Tania Hardie for their exceptional commitment to SSWA throughout the year.

2020 SECONDARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

2020 was certainly a challenging year for School Sport WA and indeed sport in schools across Western Australia. Covid-19 had an impact on our operations in a manner like nothing we have experienced previously, however, I am incredibly proud of the way our dedicated and resourceful staff approached the situation and sought meaningful and innovative solutions to keeping students in WA schools engaged in sport.

One such innovation was the Virtual Cross-Country event that was conceived and implemented by Robyn Brierley, allowing the students from WA to "compete" against the rest of the nation's students by way of entering their best times into a data base of students from other states. While this didn't allow for the opportunity of actual physical competition, it did allow our students to compare their rankings nationally in a competitive environment.

On top of the interschool upheaval, we also had the upheaval of relocating our office from Royal St to Tuart College, a huge undertaking in itself given the physical and technological tasks involved. The relocation went relatively smoothly and it has given us the opportunity to have all of our physical resources together at one venue, which was previously not possible.

The shutdown of face-to-face sporting activities enabled the SSWA office staff to streamline some practices, plan for the future and generally plan for providing enriched outcomes for students and schools in the years ahead.

The other significant undertaking for SSWA during 2020 was the continued planning for the inaugural Teachers' Games, to be held in Mandurah during October 2021. I urge as many teachers from around the state as possible to participate in the event and make it a success for this year and beyond. Robyn has put an enormous amount of time and effort into getting this up and running, and I would like to congratulate her for her vision and energy.

Although Senior High Schools Country Week wasn't possible in 2020, we were able to manage a District High Schools Country Week, much to the enjoyment of the staff and students from those participating schools. SSWA looks forward to hosting both Senior and District High Schools for their regular Country Weeks in 2021.

On behalf of staff, students and parents across the state of Western Australia, I would like to take the opportunity to thank and congratulate the hard-working staff in the School Sport Office under the astute guidance of Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley and Lynda Merritt for managing the Covid-19 situation so professionally. Without their tireless work, the students of Western Australia would be lacking in future quality sporting opportunities. I would also like to thank Sally, Christine, Tamara and Tania for their dedicated service to School Sport WA.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 - Summary of Accounting Policies

The School Sport Western Australia Inc (SSWA) is not a reporting entity because, in the Board's opinion, there are unlikely to exist users of the accounts who are dependent on general purpose financial reports of SSWA for information. This financial report therefore is a "Special Purpose Financial Report". It has been drawn up so as to comply with SSWA's rules and so as to provide information by the members.

Statement of compliance

The special purpose financial report has been prepared so as to comply with SSWA's rules to provide information required by members and on the basis of accounting requirements specified by all accounting standards and interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of below accounting standards;

AASB 101 - Presentation of Financial Statements; and

AASB 108 - Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

SSWA was registered under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (previously Associations Incorporation Act 1987) on 20 June 1989.

Basis of Preparation

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical cost. There has been no revaluation of assets.

(a) Revenue and other income

Revenue comprises of government grants, income received from participants in school activities and other miscellaneous income.

Government grants

SSWA's school programs are supported by grants received from the Department of Education. Government grants are not recognised until there is reasonable assurance that SSWA will comply with the conditions attaching to them and that the grants will be received. Government grants are recognised in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the periods in which the SSWA recognises as expenses the related costs for which the grants are intended to compensate.

Income from sports activities

Income from school sport events are recognised upon performance of the event.

Interest and other income

All the other income is recognised once the entitlement to receive such income is established.

(b) Tax and GST

School Sport Western Australia (Inc) is an income tax exempt body.

SSWA was registered for GST on 1 July 2000.

The Net amount of Goods and Services Tax and GST recoverable from or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included as a current asset or liability in the Balance Sheet.

Revenue, Expenses and Assets are recognized net of GST.

(c) Employee entitlements

The amounts expected to be paid to employees for their pro-rata entitlement to long service leave and annual leave are accrued annually at current pay rates.

Note 2 - Related Parties

SSWA office consists of seven employees, three of which are employed by the Department of Education and four are employed by the association.

Further Department of Education provides premises rent-free, pays for rates, electricity, postage, water and other miscellaneous services.

SSWA has decided to adopt the policy option not to recognise above services received. Accordingly, no amounts are recognised in the financial statements.


