2021 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The AGM will mark the 6th anniversary of the commencement of my role as President of SSWA and it has once again given me great pride to represent you all at various forums and events. Whilst it probably goes without saying that Covid-19 has had an enormous impact on the past year's activities there have been nevertheless quite a number of positives over the last twelve months. I would like to outline those positives here in the report as we will continue to strive toward our mission of "Providing Quality Sporting Opportunities to students in Western Australian schools". Thank you to all who have played their part in helping us to achieve that ambition once again.

Champion Schools:

Thankfully our Champion Schools events have returned to near normal after the disruption of 2020 and 2021. It would be fair to say that the numbers of team and individual nominations are generally down on pre-Covid days, however in a number of events our nominations are at an all-time high. Our association and the Sports Co-ordinators will need to work hard to bring the numbers back up and I am sure they will.

The Interstate Scene:

For the second year running School Sport Australia had to make the unenviable decision to cancel the Interstate Programs for 2021. As it turned out this was a wise decision again as state borders were ultimately closed preventing interstate travel. School Sport Australia have retained the interstate hosting roster as it was planned in 2021 and rolled it into 2022. As an organisation we feel for the students who have missed out on the opportunity to represent their state and hope to see the program re instituted as soon as is possible.

The Office:

The School Sport W.A. office staff have had a busy year. We have had to cope with a number of staff having to take extended leave and this of course has placed an added workload onto those who remain. We have had to say goodbye to our interstate co-ordinator Tamara Wright and we thank Tamara for her contribution to our organisation. Congratulations to Sally Foot and husband Aled on the birth of Cooper. Sally has now returned to work Mon - Wed.

New Initiatives:

The cancellation of the interstate program for the second year running provided SSWA with the opportunity to think outside the box. Each of our sports groups was encouraged to select a representative Western Australian team and, where possible, provide that team with a regional or home-based experience. Many of our sports, both 12 yrs and under and 13yrs and over used the opportunity to tour our regional areas. SSWA teams visited the length and breadth of W.A. up to Karratha, down to Albany and out to Kalgoorlie. We had some very worthwhile events conducted in the metro area for other teams. The feedback from students, parents and the regional areas has been tremendous to read. Well done to all who provided a memorable experience for our higher performers in 2021.

Conclusion:

On behalf of the board of School Sport W.A. I would like to sincerely thank the S.S.W.A. office staff consisting of Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Alex McLennan, Christine Sheen, Sally Foot and Tania Hardie, who, very ably led by Peter Smith, have done a wonderful job of conducting business, often in difficult circumstances, for the last twelve months. I thank Alex McLennan for filling in for Lynda during her leave, he has been very professional during his term in office. My thanks also go to my fellow board members who have willingly given their time for the benefit of students within our schools. A particular thank you to my two Vice Presidents, Alex McLennan and Narelle Scott (Primary) and Kelvin Browner (Secondary) who have done a wonderful job and filled in for me on occasions this year as they have done in previous years. A particular thanks to Kelvin Browner for stepping in to fill absences in the office at various times over the last twelve months. Also thank you to the finance committee of Clayton Bird, Narelle Scott and Lorraine Feddema headed by treasurer Wayne Baseden who have done wonders this year to make sure we continue on a sound financial pathway.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the support of the Department of Education in this difficult time. The continued assistance given with the grant and the financial certainty that has come with it has enabled us to work with surety and enabled us to put ourselves in a strong fiscal position for the years to come.

Following on from the challenging year that was in 2020, this year was a slight step forward, but did still not allow SSWA to return to full operations. Covid-19 had a similar impact on our operations; however, I am incredibly proud of the way our dedicated and resourceful staff were able to get as many of our sports and activities functioning as efficiently as the Government Health Advice permitted.

Many Interschool programs ran in a modified fashion, allowing the students in schools in WA the opportunity to take part in meaningful sporting pursuits throughout the year. I would like to extend my thanks to all of the hard-working coaches, managers and mentors in schools across Western Australia for their hard work and dedication to their students, and for making the experiences for their teams the best they could be under the circumstances. Of course, not all sports were able to operate as successfully as others. Some sports failed to occur in 2021 due to severe Covid restrictions, highlighted by the fact that Country Week was not able to take place for the senior students from our country schools for the second time since its inception. This was extremely disappointing for all concerned, and my heartfelt sympathy goes to all of those that were affected by the situation – particularly those in their final year of school. Some students were in the unfortunate situation of being on their way to Perth (in either buses or planes) when they were contacted and forced to turn around and go home due to the Government protocols that were put into place.

Although Senior High Schools Country Week wasn't possible in 2021, we were able to manage a District High Schools Country Week, much to the enjoyment of the staff and students from those participating schools. SSWA looks forward to hosting both Senior and District High Schools for their regular Country Weeks in 2022.

The biggest positive to come out of 2021 from a SSWA perspective was the inaugural Teachers' Games, held in Mandurah during the October school holidays. This was a fantastic event that promoted camaraderie, sporting opportunities and positive mental health outcomes for teachers from across Western Australia. I would like to thank the event organiser – Robyn Brierley – and her team from SSWA, along with the plethora of volunteers that chipped in to help out, for staging such a wonderful event. I am sure it will continue to grow throughout the years ahead.

On behalf of staff, students, and parents across the state of Western Australia, I would like to take the opportunity to thank and congratulate the hard-working staff in the School Sport Office under the astute guidance of Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley, Alex McLennan and Lynda Merritt for managing our organisation so professionally. Without their tireless work, the students of Western Australia would be lacking in quality sporting opportunities. I would also like to thank our office staff for their dedicated service to School Sport WA.

2021 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

After a most challenging 2020, there was a determination to provide as many sporting opportunities as possible to students. While 2021 still had its challenges, the School Sport WA Staff - led by Peter Smith, Management Group and volunteers all worked towards providing experiences that gave our students to best opportunity to participate and compete with their peers.

Throughout 2021, many Primary sporting opportunities we offered, and I thank and congratulate the Sport Coordinators involved. Basketball, Cross Country, Football (Soccer), Futsal, Golf, Handball, Hockey, Orienteering, Swimming, Tennis and Triathlon were all well supported by schools and many sports saw an increase in participants from pre-Covid years.

For the first time, there was a second day of Primary swimming competition with the addition of the Churchlands Cell competing in a stand-alone competition following on from the black and gold divisions. We also saw the return of the West Coast Fever Champions Cup in Netball with a nail-biting conclusion to the event that resulted in a drawn Grand Final between Gooseberry Hill PS and Hollywood PS. There were many happy players after both schools were awarded gold medals and dual winners. Other highlights for the year were the highest numbers of competitors or teams involved in the Primary competitions for Basketball, Cross Country and Diving.

Once again in 2021, there were no School Sport Australia Championships held, however School Sport WA made the decision to select State teams and provide sporting experiences to these students. This allowed Team Officials the opportunity to develop their own authentic experiences for selected teams.

Some sports chose to travel Intrastate, with many (Hockey, Netball, AFL 12's Boys, Basketball, Football) heading South to regions including Bunbury, Margaret River, Busselton and Albany. The 12's Cricket boys and girls went north with a regional trip to Geraldton. Reports from officials were that the State Teams were warmly welcomed by the regional towns which helped to further promote the School Sport WA brand. Other sports, including Tennis and Rugby League chose to stay in Perth and provide experiences such as challenge games and training camps.

One highlight of the State Team experiences saw the Inaugural WA Girls' AFL 12 Years & Under team selected from around 100 nominations. These girls played exceptionally well in football games against older High School students and toured facilitates such as Optus Stadium, WA Institute of Sport and the West Coast Eagles.

A huge thank you must go to the Team Officials for organising team experiences. The commitment shown towards providing students with the opportunity to be acknowledged and participate as part of a state team was outstanding.

I wish to thank your Primary Management Committee, represented by Lorraine Feddema, Clayton Bird, John Lawniczak, Royce Puccinelli and Daryl Mansfield, for the contributions made to Primary Sport across the year. I also would like to acknowledge, Alex McLennan, for the leadership he showed as the Primary Vice President and continues to provide in the role of Executive Officer at School Sport WA. Thank you also to Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt and Kelvin Browner for their support and guidance as Executive Officers during 2021.

2022 is set to provide its own unique set of challenges and I look forward to working alongside the School Sport WA Staff and volunteers as we navigate our way through and continue to provide quality sporting experiences for our students.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 - Summary of Accounting Policies

The School Sport Western Australia Inc (SSWA) is not a reporting entity because, in the Board's opinion, there are unlikely to exist users of the accounts who are dependent on general purpose financial reports of SSWA for information. This financial report therefore is a "Special Purpose Financial Report". It has been drawn up so as to comply with SSWA's rules and so as to provide information by the members.

Statement of compliance

The special purpose financial report has been prepared so as to comply with SSWA's rules to provide information required by members and on the basis of accounting requirements specified by all accounting standards and interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of below accounting standards;

AASB 101 - Presentation of Financial Statements; and

AASB 108 - Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

SSWA was registered under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (previously Associations Incorporation Act 1987) on 20 June 1989.

Basis of Preparation

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical cost. There has been no revaluation of assets.

(a) Revenue and other income

Revenue comprises of government grants, income received from participants in school activities and other miscellaneous income.

Government grants

SSWA's school programs are supported by grants received from the Department of Education.

Government grants are not recognised until there is reasonable assurance that SSWA will comply with the conditions attaching to them and that the grants will be received. Government grants are recognised in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the periods in which the SSWA recognises as expenses the related costs for which the grants are intended to compensate.

Income from sports activities

Income from school sport events are recognised upon performance of the event.

Interest and other income

All the other income is recognised once the entitlement to receive such income is established.

(b) Tax and GST

School Sport Western Australia (Inc) is an income tax exempt body.

SSWA was registered for GST on 1 July 2000.

The Net amount of Goods and Services Tax and GST recoverable from or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included as a current asset or liability in the Balance Sheet.

Revenue, Expenses and Assets are recognized net of GST.

(c) Employee entitlements

The amounts expected to be paid to employees for their pro-rata entitlement to long service leave and annual leave are accrued annually at current pay rates.

Note 2 - Related Parties

SSWA office consists of seven employees, three of which are employed by the Department of Education and four are employed by the association.

Further Department of Education provides premises rent-free, pays for rates, electricity, postage, water and other miscellaneous services.

SSWA has decided to adopt the policy option not to recognise above services received. Accordingly, no amounts are recognised in the financial statements.
