

Interschool Swimming Carnivals 2023 Briefing Notes

Lane allocation for each day is below. Schools must swim in the same **lane** for every race.

Emergency: All staff and students must follow the directions of the HBF Stadium staff

Medical: First aid is located near the bottom of the stairs on the pool deck. Access is via the main stairs to pool deck.

Events and Year Groups / Ages: Events are conducted in year groups. The age cutoff for the year group is 30th June. The following cutoffs will apply:

Year Group	Age cutoffs
Year 7	1 July 2010 – 30 June 2011
Year 8	1 July 2009 – 30 June 2010
Year 9	1 July 2008 – 30 June 2009
Year 10	1 July 2007 – 30 June 2008
Year 11	1 July 2006 – 30 June 2007
Year 12 & over	Before June 30 2006

All swimmers must have their year group marked clearly on their left arm with a permanent marker pen – approx 8cm tall. This will assist marshals in ensuring that swimmers are competing in the correct age group.

Presentation Area: The first 3 place getters will be required to assemble at the presentation dais and be announced.

Presentation Ceremony: All schools are required to stay for the Presentation Ceremony. Team Marshals and supervising teachers are asked to have all students seated quietly in their areas immediately after the last event. The Captain(s) from each school is/are to assemble, with their school's flag, at the finish line end of the main pool for the Indoor Pool. For A and B Division carnivals in the Outdoor Pool the presentations will be on the western side of the pool close to the Announcers Desk. SSWA will endeavour to notify year group champions prior to the final relay events and they will be required to be available at the presentation area to receive their championship medallion.

Referees Notes: (Below)

Start: The start in Freestyle, Breaststroke, Butterfly and individual medley races shall be with a dive. The start in Backstroke and Medley Relay races shall be from the water.

False start: For 2023 Schools in C, D & E will be afforded a 2 start rule.

False Start: For A & B schools will be under the "One Start" rule.

Butterfly: At the start and at turns, the swimmer is permitted one or more leg kicks and one arm pull under water, which must bring him to the surface. It shall be permissible for a swimmer to be completely submerged for a distance of not more than 15 metres after the start and after each turn.

Breaststroke: After the start and after each turn, the swimmer may take one arm stroke completely back to the legs. The head must break the surface of the water before the hands turn inward at the widest part of the second stroke. A single downward Butterfly kick followed by a breaststroke kick is permitted while wholly

submerged. At each turn and at the finish of the race, **the touch shall be made with both hands simultaneously at, above, or below the water level.**

Backstroke: It is permissible for the swimmer to be completely submerged during the turn, at the finish and for a distance of not more than 15 metres after the start and each turn. By that point the head must have broken the surface. Upon the finish of the race the swimmer must touch the wall while on the back.

Freestyle: it shall be permissible for the swimmer to be completely submerged for not more than 15 metres after the start and each turn. By that point the head must have broken the surface.

Medley Relay: In a Medley team event relay, each team shall consist of four (4) members who shall swim respectively Backstroke, Breaststroke, Butterfly and Freestyle, in that order.

Schools are asked to bring with them:

- Swimming Team List – this is to be handed to the Carnival Manager OR to the Recording Room prior to the start of the carnival. This should include any students swimming up a year group all day as they will have to be adjusted on the Carnival database.
- Please use correct names as they appear on the SIS lists (not preferred or nick names)
- A thick black marker to write Year Group on the swimmer's arm
- An up-to-date SIS list (which we have emailed to you) – keep these with you, no need to hand them in.

Please Note:

- 2 school supervisors (minimum of 1 qualified) must supervise warm up prior to the commencement of the Carnival.
- A maximum of 32 students allowed per school in the allocated lane at any one time
- Diving pool supervision must be carried out by 2 supervisors at all times who must monitor that no more than 32 students are in the pool at any one time.

Student Officials Roster is below. Please ensure that these helpers (3 students) **meet the Carnival Manager between 9.00am and 9.15am at the Announcer's desk.** Please note that all 3 students may be needed at the same time. * SEDA assistants will also be available.

Student Assistant's Roles:

TIMEKEEPERS

- 8 required – Officials may rotate through (approx 1 – 1.5 hr roster) – (Shared by SEDA and Schools)
- During the race ensure timer is on its stand so that accidental time recording is avoided.
- Towards the conclusion of the race, timekeepers gather the timer button and stand at the pool edge to gain a clear view of the swimmer as they approach.
- As swimmer makes clear contact (touch) with the finish wall the timekeeper presses the timer button.
- Check that time has recorded.
- Replace timer button on its stand.
- Make sure the swimmer remains in their lane. Indicate where the swimmer has finished.
- Swimmers may leave the pool on the direction of the Referee.
- Organise 1st, 2nd & 3rd place getters to get to the Presentation Dais.

Other roles will be explained prior to the start by the Carnival Manager or delegated officials

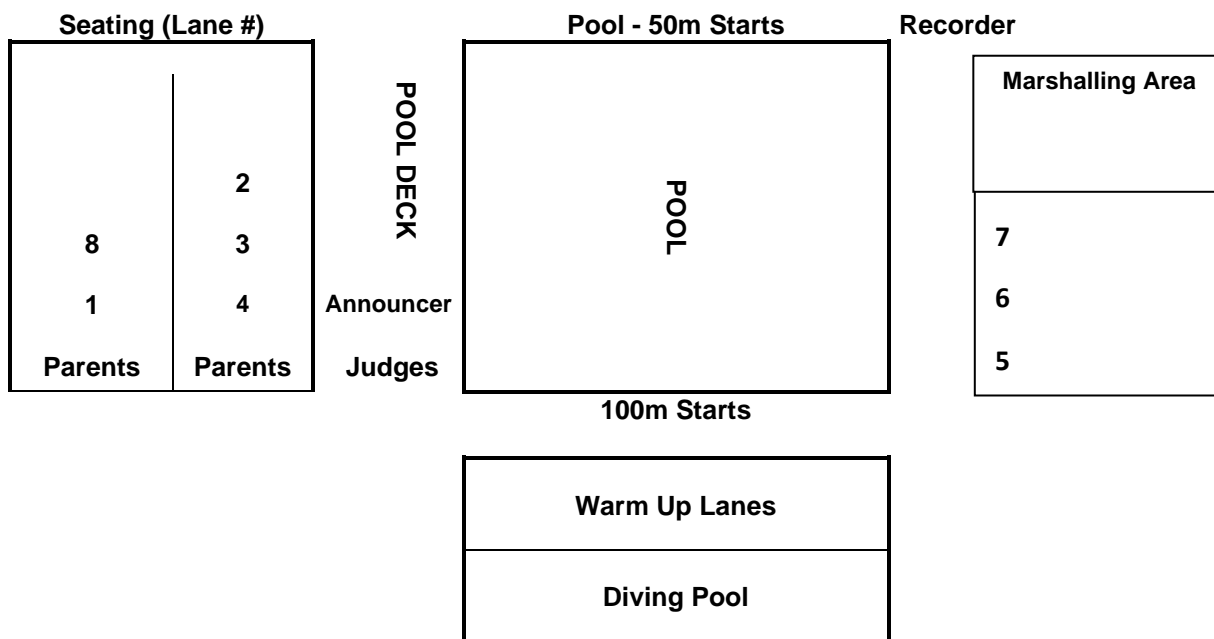
- False Start Rope

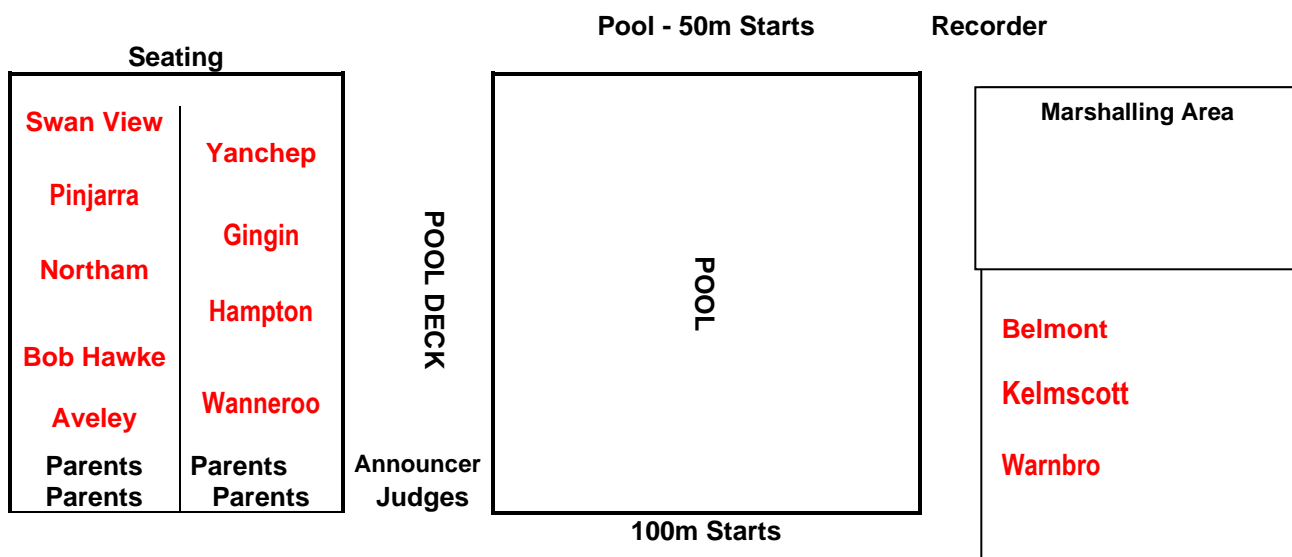
