Peter explained that although the 2021 School Sport Australia Championships were once again cancelled SSWA ensured state team experiences were provided for many of the selected State Teams. It was great to be able to name teams, the regional experiences were well received, and the support provided was greatly appreciated.  Peter reported that Champion Schools number have bounced well and there is a strong appetite for schools to participate.  The late cancellation of Country Week 2021 caused much grief and for some students the fact that the event has not run for 2 years means they have missed this opportunity in their schooling. On a positive note, DHS Country Week ran successfully.  2022 School Sport Australia Championships remained on hold for the first 6 months with the rebooting scheduled for 21 July. SSWA have recently received permission to travel under the conditions of the current Travel and School Camp Guidelines.  Country week 2022 has been moved back to term 3.  The 2021 inaugural Teachers' Games was a great success, and the event will be running again in 2022.  Peter gave a big thank you to the office staff and acknowledged that although the Interstate Program didn't occur there was still much work to be completed through the office with the State Team experiences.

Basketball, Cross Country, Football (Soccer), Futsal, Golf, Hockey, Netball, Orienteering, Swimming, Tennis and Triathlon were all well supported by schools and there were positive numbers of participants across all sports. In particular, Cross Country and Futsal had the highest number of competitors and/or teams ever recorded in their respective competitions.

The Primary Track and Field Event returned to the SSWA calendar in 2022. For the first time, the event was held in conjunction with the UWA Little Athletics Club. The 'Champion of Champions' event saw winners from their respective Interschool Track and Field Carnival invited to participate in a Friday evening competition. It was fantastic to have 222 athletes compete across the events offered and I am sure this event will continue to grow in future years. We look forward to hosting the event in conjunction with the UWA Little Athletics Club in 2023.

The second half of 2022 was extraordinarily busy with all School Sport Australia Championships held in a 6-month period. This resulted in trials, team selections and travel being condensed, and all Team Officials and School Sport WA Staff needed to be flexible in delivering the best experience possible for the Primary athletes despite many challenges along the way.

The travel model for the 12 years and Under Interstate teams provided the opportunity for parents and families to become travelling fan clubs for our WA athletes. While teams did not accommodate together, the support from parents was exceptional in providing the best opportunity for athletes to perform at their best while on tour. The positive results of the interstate teams showed that accommodating with parents and having a normal sleep routine was beneficial to optimum performance and will continue to be the preferred model in 2023.

One highlight of the Interstate program saw the 12's Boys Basketball team win gold in Ballarat, Victoria. The boys played exceptional team basketball all week and all involved should be very proud of the result. Another highlight on the interstate scene was the first ever victory against Victoria in the 12s Boys AFL. The post-match celebrations by students, parents and team officials demonstrated just how significant this victory was. A huge thank you must go to the Interstate Team Officials, the commitment shown towards providing students with the opportunity to be acknowledged and participate as part of a state team was outstanding.

I wish to thank your Primary Management Committee, represented by Lorraine Feddema, Clayton Bird, John Lawniczak, Royce Puccinelli and Daryl Mansfield, for the contributions made to Primary Sport across the year. Thank you also to Robyn Brierley, Alex McLennan, Lynda Merritt and Kelvin Browner for their support and guidance as Executive Officers during 2022.

While we continue to return to 'normal' in 2023, I am sure there will continue to be some challenges as we continue to promote School Sport WA events to Primary athletes. I look forward to working alongside the School Sport WA Staff and volunteers as we navigate our way through and continue to provide quality sporting experiences for our students.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### Note 1 - Summary of Accounting Policies

The School Sport Western Australia Inc (SSWA) is not a reporting entity because, in the Board's opinion, there are unlikely to exist users of the accounts who are dependent on general purpose financial reports of SSWA for information. This financial report therefore is a "Special Purpose Financial Report". It has been drawn up so as to comply with SSWA's rules and so as to provide information by the members.

#### Statement of compliance

The special purpose financial report has been prepared so as to comply with SSWA's rules to provide information required by members and on the basis of accounting requirements specified by all accounting standards and interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of below accounting standards;

AASB 101 - Presentation of Financial Statements; and

AASB 108 - Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

SSWA was registered under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (previously Associations Incorporation Act 1987) on 20 June 1989.

#### Basis of Preparation

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical cost. There has been no revaluation of assets.

##### (a) Revenue and other income

Revenue comprises of government grants, income received from participants in school activities and other miscellaneous income.

##### *Government grants*

SSWA's school programs are supported by grants received from the Department of Education.

Government grants are not recognised until there is reasonable assurance that SSWA will comply with the conditions attaching to them and that the grants will be received. Government grants are recognised in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the periods in which the SSWA recognises as expenses the related costs for which the grants are intended to compensate.

##### *Income from sports activities*

Income from school sport events are recognised upon performance of the event.

*Interest and other income*

All the other income is recognised once the entitlement to receive such income is established.

**(b) Tax and GST**

School Sport Western Australia (Inc) is an income tax exempt body.

SSWA was registered for GST on 1 July 2000.

The Net amount of Goods and Services Tax and GST recoverable from or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included as a current asset or liability in the Balance Sheet.

Revenue, Expenses and Assets are recognized net of GST.

**(c) Employee entitlements**

The amounts expected to be paid to employees for their pro-rata entitlement to long service leave and annual leave are accrued annually at current pay rates.

**Note 2 - Related Parties**

SSWA office consists of seven employees, three of which are employed by the Department of Education and four are employed by the association.

Further Department of Education provides premises rent-free, pays for rates, electricity, postage, water and other miscellaneous services.

SSWA has decided to adopt the policy option not to recognise above services received. Accordingly, no amounts are recognised in the financial statements.
