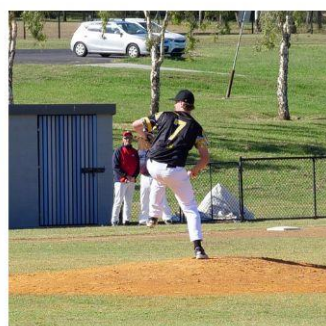

3.	President's Address	<p>Attendees were directed to the President's Report, contained within the Annual Report. Peter Rickers highlighted the fantastic resurgence of the Champion Schools competition following Covid and advised the meeting some events had record numbers.</p> <p>He stated that it was tremendous to get back into the Interstate Program and again this was very successful. Peter advised that very few States offered what SSWA did, during Covid, with the continuance of interstate selection and that this potentially led to our successful year.</p> <p>Peter passed on a thank you to those in the office and for the covering of those on leave.</p>

Outlining that many events were held outside of their normal timeframes and passed on a pat on the back to be able to action these events in such a short timeframe.</p> <p>Peter indicated that the Teachers' Games occurred again and that we are hopeful that it will be able to continue in 2023.</p> <p>He finished off acknowledging the work of the people in the office and welcomed Jess Rolfe and Emma Russell to School Sport WA.</p>

Annual Financial Report and Balance Sheet	<p>Wayne Baseden Presented the Finance Report and outlined the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The organisation processes approx. \$1.8 million annually with an overall profit of approx. \$70 000. This is a reasonable outcome in the current situation. • \$40 000 has been moved into some reserves to support the Interstate program, including equipment support and the costs involved with the introduction of a new uniform. • Surplus was put into reserves in 2021 to offset some increased costs for students involved in the interstate program. • Prices have increased for the Champion Schools program due to increased venue hire costs. • These items will be monitored and reassessed further down the track. • A reserve has been put aside for an additional SSWA employee.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The organisation is strategically looking at the way the term deposits are situated so that they are staggered with easier access.• SSWA is seeking out some major sponsorship for events and programs.• Stock control and asset registers processes are being refined and will be implemented.• The end of the Financial Year processing was outstanding with only 3 Interstate payments unsettled.• Debt recovery processes have been well established. <p>Motion: School Sport WA remove Tania Hardie from the SSWA accounts and Emma Russell be added. We have had enormous numbers and growth in many including a huge 2900 runners in the Primary Cross Country. Our officials do a fantastic job and a big shout out goes to our special bunch of retired teachers who return and officiate at so many events at a very high standard.

Events:

Congratulations to all of our teams and the staff that accompanied them on a series of well conducted and supervised events throughout the year. Our athletes and staff have once again enhanced the reputation of SSWA in regards to the behaviour and performance of our teams and individuals.

Particular congratulations must go to Triathlete Ava Henville in the Intermediate Triathlon, Xander Scholes in Cross Country and Isabella Galvao in the diving for their individual Gold Medals. Our 12/U female golfers also earned a Gold Medal in the Stroke Play. Additionally, we had many individual P.B.s in the swimming championships. Well done to all. There were many individual and team successes with overall 3 Gold, 11 Silver and 16 Bronze Individual medals and 1 Gold, 5 Silver and 10 Bronze Medals in our team events. What an awesome effort from our interstate athletes

Interestingly we entered a team in the 12/U Boys Netball for the first time. This event is new on the School Sport Australia calendar of events and we are happy to be involved in what was a fantastic event hosted here in W.A. SSWA also participated in the 12/U Golf for the first time since the most recent Pacific Schools Games.

As usual SSWA was involved in the hosting of a number of SSA National Championships. Over the last twelve months we have hosted the 12/U Netball and 15/U Netball as two separate events at the Gold Netball Centre, also the 12/U and 16/U Basketball as a combined event at the Willetton Basketball Stadium. All of these events were convened by Robyn Brierley and what a wonderful job she has done and this has been acknowledged by all visiting contingents. We also held the 12/U Golf at various courses around the metropolitan area convened by Peter Smith, thanks Peter. A characteristic of all these events was the fantastic support from the state sporting organisations and the staff at the venues themselves. This produced great outcomes for all involved.

SSWA hosted the SSA 12 years and under Netball, 15 years and under Netball, 12s and 16 years and under Basketball and 12 years and under Golf.

2023 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

For the first time since the Covid years, it was fantastic to return to a full year of Interstate and Interschool sporting opportunities for Primary aged students. As rules and guidelines continued to move towards the 'new normal,' the School Sport WA Staff – led by Peter Smith, Management Group and volunteers once again provided quality sporting opportunities for our students to participate and compete with their peers.

Strong numbers were seen across all Primary Interschool sporting events and I thank the Sport Coordinators for their efforts in the promotion and organisation of these events. Cross Country once again exceeded expectations with the highest number of competitors (2800) ever recorded. Futsal, Golf and Hockey had the highest number of competitors and/or teams ever recorded in their respective competitions. An exciting event for the Primary age group saw the Girls Football (Soccer) Champions Cup named after our home grown star, Sam Kerr. On the boys side of the Football Championship, we celebrated the 20th Year of the Stan Lazaridis Cup.

Consolidating and building upon the success of the Primary Track and Field Carnival in 2022, the 2023 event had an increase in numbers. It was a real highlight seeing all the competitors competing against the best from other Primary Networks under lights at UWA Little Athletics Club. We look forward to continuing the relationship with Little Athletics and expand on the number of events offered.

I would like to thank the teaching staff across all of our Western Australian primary schools for giving WA primary students the experience of being involved in interschool sport competition. Of particular note, congratulations go to Rosalie Primary School, who have won the 2023 Most Active School Award, competing in 9 SSWA Champion Schools events. Congratulations also to Riverton Primary School (8 events) and Richmond Primary School (7 events).

All 12 Year and Under Interstate Teams performed exceptionally well and represented the black swan with pride. Medals were won across many sports including Australian Football Girls and Boys, and Football Girls. The Basketball Girls and Boys teams both medalled and were cheered on by the masses during a home championship held at the Willetton Basketball Stadium. School Sport WA also hosted the 12's Golf Championship in 2023. For the first time since 2017, WA were represented on course by 12 talented golfers. The girls team finished 1st in the Stroke Competition and WA finished 4th overall.

One of my personal highlights was watching the Inaugural WA 12's Boys Netball Team compete at the 12 Years Netball School Sport Australia Championship. Hosted in Perth at the WA Netball Centre, the boys team was supported on the sidelines by the WA Girls team as well as friends and family.
