2024 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The AGM will mark the 9th Anniversary of my role as President of your association, School Sport W.A. and as usual it has given me great pride to represent you all at various functions and events. I will remind everyone of our mission statement "Providing Quality Sporting Opportunities to students in Western Australian Schools", and I believe we have done a sterling job in reaching for that goal over the 12 months that this report covers. This has been achieved by an enormous number of volunteers who give of their time freely for the benefit of young people in our care and I thank you all on behalf of the schools the students and their parents.

Interschool Events:

A number of our events have seen growth once again and I have been privileged to attend a large number of our flagship events most of which have been on our calendar for many years and continue to thrive. The Senior and District High Schools Country Week events, the Swimming and Athletics Carnivals, the Primary and Secondary Cross Country and the Primary and Secondary Triathlon were a pleasure to attend. Congratulations to Shenton College for winning the "McMahon Shield" and Rosalie Primary School for winning "The Most Active" Primary School awards acknowledging Participation and Performance in our domestic interschool offerings. Our S.S.W.A. interschool officials do a fantastic job, and a big shout out goes to our special bunch of retired teachers who return and officiate at so many events. Because of this the quality of our events is maintained at a particularly high level.

The Interstate Scene:

Congratulations to all our teams and the staff that accompanied them on a series of well conducted and supervised events throughout the year. Our athletes and staff have once again enhanced the reputation of SSWA due to the behaviour, sportsmanship and performance of our teams and individuals.

The Board of School Sport Australia has decided to embark on a series of Multi Sport events known as "The School Sport Australia Games". Games number 1 was conducted on the Gold Coast, Queensland in August 2024. The sports covered were, Australian Football, Softball, Hockey, Swimming, Netball and Basketball. Whilst the enormity of the event has provided some challenges for the event organisers there were sufficient positives to move on with this concept. I was privileged to attend the event on behalf of School Sport W.A. and was once again very proud to see the efforts of our staff and students. The concept of multi-sports events will continue into 2025.

Congratulations:

We entered a team in the S.S.A. Lawn Bowls Championships for the first time and we are happy to be involved in what was a fantastic event hosted in Geelong, Victoria.

This year we hosted the Aquathlon and Triathlon events on the foreshore in Rockingham. Later in August we hosted the 16's Boys and 18's Girls Football Championships followed by the 12's Boys and Girls Football with both football events at Lark Hill in Port Kennedy. A characteristic of all these events was the fantastic support from the state sporting organisations and the staff at the venues themselves. This produced great outcomes for all involved. Thank you to Robyn Brierley-Scott and staff at the Aquathlon/Triathlon event for their professionalism. I had the opportunity to conduct both Football events and was greatly assisted by Wayne Baseden, Tony Carvajal, Joe Wright and Neil Addison well done gentlemen.

Well done to the 15's Boys Australian Rules team, the 16's Boys Basketball team and the 12's Girls Golf team (Teams Net) who all won their National Championships, it was very exciting to be in the crowd on the day for both the AFL and Basketball Boys finals. What wonderful support there was from families and friends in the enormous crowds who had travelled to support their teams.

In 2024 School Sport WA prepared and supported 41 interstate teams who participated in School Sport Australia National Championships, of these teams 14 of them managed to win a gold, silver or bronze medal and that is 34% of our teams. It must be said that we have had a very successful year. All teams however should be congratulated on their performance, sportsmanship and efforts.

School Sport Australia Service Awards:

To emphasise the impact being made and the work being done by our interstate coaches, managers and tour leaders, two were acknowledged with SSA Service Awards for a minimum of ten years of service at the National Championship level. A huge thank you and congratulations go to Scott Halpin Football 12 Years and Arphirak (Luckie) Paul for Touch Football and Peter Smith for Cricket.

The Office:

As usual the office has been particularly busy, and I would like to acknowledge and thank the office staff of Jess Rolfe, Emma Russell, Cam Pollock, Hayley Smith, Stacy Fleming, Leigh Willison, Alex McLennan, Robyn Brierley-Scott and Peter Smith. Thank you to you all for the hard work and professionalism shown throughout the year.

The board and office staff participated in a range of P.D. during the year provided to us by “Leading Teams”, both the staff and the board have found this valuable.

Teachers Games:

Whilst the numbers were a little down in some sports they were up in others from 2023, the event was nevertheless a tremendous success. Many individuals connected with SSWA stepped up to conduct the events on our behalf and as a result the outcomes were first class. Thank you to those who gave up their time to ensure the event was a success.

Conclusion:

I would like to thank the Education Department for its continued support of our organisation through the Grant Agreement. Interestingly, we are in the middle of an 18-month extension to the Grant Agreement that was requested by the Education Department. This extension started in July 2024 and will conclude at the end of 2025. The number of schools and individuals accessing our program of events at domestic and inter-state level continues to expand exponentially. All of this coupled with more sports wanting to come onto the SSWA calendar of events and the continued growth of offerings at the National Championship levels provides us with both an opportunity and a challenge.

We must continue to attract committed teachers into our ranks in order to manage the growth we are seeing. Please make every attempt to recruit and retain people in your areas of interest.

Financially we are in a sound position moving into 2025, particular thanks to Mr Wayne Baseden for the work he has done on our accounts and with the finance staff in the office. My thanks go to our two Vice Presidents, Mr Kelvin Browner (Secondary) and Mrs Narelle Brierley-Scott (Primary) for being such fantastic support to me when required throughout the last twelve months. Thanks also to my fellow board members who provide a continued direction for our association and devote many hours both for the collective and for the sports with which they are associated.
