BACKGROUND

The Primary Schools' Swimming Carnival was re-introduced by School Sport WA in 1988 when six schools competed at Beatty Park. The move to Challenge Stadium (now Perth HPC) in 1997 enabled schools and participants to utilise the improved technology and in particular the chance to appreciate swimmer times presented on the electronic display board at the conclusion of each race.

The Central Coastal Group schools competition run by School Sport WA was a relationship that began in 2021.

CARNIVAL PROCEDURES

CONDITIONS

1. Schools will provide a **complete team list** of their swimming team on the template which is downloaded from the website and **submit it by email to info@schoolsportwa.com.au**
2. Events are conducted in **YEAR GROUPS**.
3. During the event, if an existing year group record is broken it will only be recognised if the student falls within the accepted age cut-offs for that year group (**see table below**).

Year Group	Age Cut-offs
Year 4	1 July 2016 – 30 June 2017
Year 5	1 July 2015 – 30 June 2016
Year 6	1 July 2014 – 30 June 2015

4. All swimmers must have their Year Group marked clearly on their left arm with a permanent felt marker pen – approx 8cm tall. This will assist marshals in ensuring that swimmers are competing in the correct year group.
5. One representative per school per event.
6. Open events (if any) are available to swimmers of any year. Schools must indicate to the recorders and Chief Marshal that a swimmer is swimming out of year group. A Swimmer can swim up an age group but not down.
7. Swimmers cannot compete in both Division A and B (or C or D) of the same stroke. It is recommended that competitors wear swimming caps, but is not compulsory.
8. No Technical/Performance Race Suits will be allowed as per [Swimming WA Competition Policy \(1st May 2018\)](#). Non-bonded swimwear in a kneesuit (for girls) and jammers (boys) is allowed.

10. Teams will swim in the same lane for each event.

11. Points will be awarded to each competitor/team in all events as follows:

Individual swim events

A Divisions: 12, 9, 7, 5, 3, 2, 1, 1

B Divisions: 9, 7, 5, 3, 2, 1, 1, 1

C Divisions: 7, 5, 3, 2, 1, 1, 1, 1

D Divisions: 7, 5, 3, 2, 1, 1, 1, 1

Open Events: 12, 9, 7, 5, 3, 2, 1, 1

Relays: 24, 18, 14, 10, 6, 4, 2, 1

12. We will be using a computerised scoring system. Schools are asked to maintain a careful register of their team.

13. Honour certificates will be awarded to first, second and third placegetters.

14. A Champion School Shield will be awarded to the winning team.

15. A Meritorious Shield is also awarded and is calculated as total number of points achieved for the carnival divided by the school population (Yrs 4 - 6). A school cannot win both the Champion School Shield and the Meritorious Shield at the same carnival. If a school finishes top for both shield calculations the second placed school will be awarded the Meritorious Shield. School population numbers will be taken from the Department of Education school numbers data.

16. Year Group Champions - Points will be allocated to students who compete in A Division events and in other events for which they are eligible by year group i.e. underage or open events if they are included in the program. The points gained will be credited to their year grouping and will be allocated according to the points gained by the school event.

Please note: ONLY A Division swimmers accumulate Championship points

A Division event 12, 9, 7, 5, 3, 2, 1, 1

ADMINISTRATION

- 1 Schools are responsible for their own transport arrangements, general first aid requirements and team organisation. Designated first aid personnel will attend to treat more serious medical situations.
- 2 Schools will be invoiced for the **nomination fee** from School Sport WA.
- 3 The pool entry cost is **\$4.90** per student and SSWA will record your swim team numbers on the day and issue an invoice for nomination fee and pool entry.
- 4 Spectators are permitted and must enter through the Main Entrance to Perth HPC and the entry fee **\$2.60** is payable at the pool entrance desk..
- 5 Seating arrangements - Using the allocated lane number, schools will be placed in specific seating areas. Please check the map provided.
- 6 School swimmers or spectators are not permitted to leave their allocated area except under the direction of team officials (toilet breaks, compete in events etc).
- 7 Schools to supply copies of the 'Program of Events' for spectators.
- 8 Only competitors may enter the water.
- 9 Carnival officials will be permitted to walk the pool deck. Spectators are not permitted on the pool deck and must adhere to instructions given regarding movement to and from events.
- 10 **Officials**
 - This carnival could not operate without considerable support from student officials.
 - **Each school must provide student officials** (detailed later in this booklet).
 - An outline of the duties for each official is contained in this booklet. Officials will be briefed prior to the carnival.
 - **Officials are not required to pay an entry fee.**
 - All officials to report to the Carnival Manager by 9.45am.
- 11 All participating schools are to provide a mobile phone contact number of a staff member who is attending the event. This is to enable event officials to contact a school staff member for information or in case of emergency.
- 12 Schools are advised that SSWA will be Live Streaming this event along with a photographer being in attendance to take photos of the presentations. Please inform SSWA Carnival Manager, Royce Puccinelli, of any restrictions for certain students either prior to the carnival or on the day of the carnival.

CONDUCT OF EVENTS

- 1 Team Marshals are responsible for ensuring that their swimmers are ready well before the event.
- 2 Team Marshals are to organise their competitors to report to the Chief Marshal at the 50m start area of the pool at least six (6) but usually ten (10) events prior to their event.
- 3 The Start Marshal sits the competitors behind the appropriate lane (chairs will be provided) and will assist the Chief Marshal as required.
- 4 Prior to the carnival, teachers should instruct their students to the following procedures:

Start Procedure:

Signal from Chief Referee	Swimmer's Action
(a) Whistle blast	Step onto the block, stand steady Listen and relax.

Signal from Starter

(b) "Take your mark"	Move to the normal start position, Wait in a steady position.
(c) Horn	Go!

Finish Procedure:

- (a) Swim hard to the finish and **touch firmly**.
 - (b) Move back from the wall. Do not hang off the wall. **Stay in the allocated lane**. Rest on the lane rope until the judges confirm the correct result. The Referee will signal by whistle for the swimmers to leave the pool.
 - (c) Competitors leave the pool **via the steps**. The first three place getters are to follow an Announcer's Assistant to the presentation dais and wait to be announced. Non-placegetters return to their team assembly area.
- 5 Medley Relay
- The order of strokes for the medley relay is: Backstroke, Breaststroke, Butterfly and Freestyle.

PRESENTATIONS

- After the last event Team Captains and Year Group Champions will gather at the presentation area.
- Team Captains should have their **school flag and/or mascot** with them for the presentation.
- Competitors and spectators will remain in their allocated school area.

Schools are also asked to provide **two 'responsible' student officials** to assist in the following duties:
(Schools should bring four student helpers and rotate them throughout the day 2 on / 2 off)

DUTIES OF EVENT OFFICIALS

CARNIVAL MANAGER (supplied by School Sport WA)

- * Be responsible for the organisation of the carnival prior to the event and on the day.
- * Check that all officials are present and aware of their duties 20 minutes before carnival is due to commence.

REFEREE (Swimming WA accredited official)

- * Pre-requisite: Must have a thorough knowledge of swimming, swimming laws and carnival procedures.
- * Only the Referee will disqualify competitors for any violation of the rules.
- * Before any disqualification is made, the Referee must be positive that the infringement took place and can explain to the competitor the reason for the disqualification.
- * The Referee should be positioned so as to have an uninterrupted view of the Starter, competitors and the finish.
- * The Referee should signal to the Starter when to start the next event.
- * The Referee should signal the Starter by a whistle blast to start the next event. On this whistle the swimmers stand on the rear of the blocks.
- * Demonstrate false start rope procedure to officials.

CHIEF JUDGE

- * Any discrepancy in judging will be managed and solved by the Chief Judge. The Chief Judge will record all places for each event as the competitors' finish.
- * All decisions of the Chief Judge are final and not subject to protest.
- * Assist as a Relay Steward.

ASSISTANT JUDGES

- * Will be responsible for timing of first and second place for every event. This time will be noted and will be used only if the computer timing fails to function for that event.

STARTER

OFFICIAL

- * The Starter assumes control of the competitors from the time they step up onto their blocks until after the signal to start has been given.
- * When the whistle is blown by the Referee, the competitors will immediately step up onto their blocks and stand steady.
- * The Starter gives the command "Take Your Marks". All competitors will immediately and without delay assume their starting position.
- * Once all competitors are perfectly still the signal to start is given and the false start rope is raised.
- * If a false start occurs, the pistol or hooter is sounded again to recall competitors. Second false start: The Starter shall recall the competitors after the SECOND FALSE START and, as a group, inform them that should any competitor be responsible for a further false start, they shall be disqualified.
- * Assist as a Relay Steward

ASSISTANT START MARSHAL

- * Relieve the Starter if necessary.
- * Seat swimmers on the chair behind the appropriate lane.
- * Ensure that all events are run in the correct order.
- * Oversee the marshalling area to ensure that no spectators enter the area.
- * Assist as a Relay Steward.
- * Assist the Chief Marshal as required.

CHIEF MARSHAL

- * Check that the appropriate marshalling sheet is completed and sent to the computer recording room.
- * Ensure that the events are run in the correct order.
- * Assemble students from marshalling area and direct them to the Check Starter.
- * Assist as a Relay Steward.

ASSISTANT CHIEF MARSHALL

- * To assist the Chief Marshall in duties as listed above.

ANNOUNCER

- * The Announcer must be conversant with the arrangements regarding the meet.
- * The person selected to announce should have a voice suitable for microphone work and have clear diction. He/she will make all announcements pertaining to the meet.
- * It is the Announcer's role to inject interest and enthusiasm into the meet with race information.
- * Announce first three placegetters after each race.

ASSISTANT ANNOUNCER

- * To assist the Announcer in duties as listed above.

POOLSIDE RECORDER

- * Record name and school from swimmers against their allocated lane.
- * Send one sheet to the computer room and one sheet to the Announcer as indicated on the recording book.

POOL DECK ASSISTANTS SUPERVISOR

- * Supervise students in their role.

DUTIES OF STUDENT OFFICIALS

FALSE START ROPE STEWARDS

- * Take control of the false start rope when the Referee blows the whistle indicating the race is about to start.
- * In the event of a false start, which is signalled by the Starter firing a second shot or sounding the hooter, the Rope Stewards shall immediately lower the rope and hold it stretched tight on the surface of the water thereby preventing any competitor from continuing the race.

ANNOUNCER ASSISTANT

- * Duties as directed by the Announcer.

POOLSIDE RECORDER ASSISTANTS

- * Take duplicate copies of results from the Poolside Recorder to the Announcer and Computer Room before each event.
- * Take cumulative totals from the Computer Operator to the Announcer as required.

FINISH ASSISTANTS

- * Ensure that the first three place getters are taken to the Announcer.

POOL DECK ASSISTANTS

- * Assist with venue COVID protocols that require swimmers to wear their masks up until under Starters instructions and put back on once the swimmer exits the Pool. Assistants role is to transport the mask to the finish line.


CARNIVAL MANAGER'S ASSISTANTS

- * Duties as directed by Carnival Manager.

ASSISTANT START MARSHALS

- * Duties as directed by the Starter.

TECHNIQUE AND RULES

BREASTSTROKE TECHNIQUE

- SW 7.1**
- From the beginning of the first arm stroke after the start and after each turn, the body shall be kept on the breast.
 - It is not permitted to roll onto the back at any time.
 - Throughout the race the stroke cycle must be one arm stroke and one leg kick in that order.
- SW 7.3**
- The hands shall be pushed forward together from the breast on, under, or over the water.
 - The elbows shall be under water except for the final stroke before the turn, during the turn and for the final stroke at the finish.
 - The hands shall be brought back on or under the surface of the water. The hands shall not be brought back beyond the hip line, except during the first stroke after the start and each turn.
- SW 7.2**
- All movements of the arms shall be simultaneous and in the same horizontal plane without alternating movement.
- SW 7.4**
- During each complete cycle, some part of the swimmer's head shall break the surface of the water.
 - After the start and after each turn, the swimmer may take one arm stroke completely back to the legs.
 - The head must break the surface of the water before the hands turn inward at the widest part of the second stroke.
 - A single downward Butterfly kick followed by a breaststroke kick is permitted while wholly submerged.
 - Following which, all movements of the legs shall be simultaneous and in the same horizontal plane without alternating movement.
- SW 7.5**
- The feet must be turned outwards during the propulsive part of the kick.
 - A scissors, flutter or downward Butterfly kick is not permitted except as in SW 7.4.
 - Breaking the surface of the water with the feet is allowed unless followed by a downward dolphin kick.
- SW 7.6**
- At each turn and at the finish of the race, the touch shall be made with both hands simultaneously at, above, or below the water level.
 - The head may be submerged after the last arm pull prior to the touch, provided it breaks the surface of the water at some point during the last complete or incomplete cycle preceding the touch.

BUTTERFLY SWIMMING

- SW 8.1**
- From the beginning of the first arm stroke after the start and each turn, the body shall be kept on the breast.
 - Under water kicking on the side is allowed. It is not permitted to roll onto the back at any time.
- SW 8.2**
- Both arms shall be brought forward together over the water and brought backward simultaneously through-out the race, subject to SW 8.5
- SW 8.3**
- All up and down movements of the legs must be simultaneous.
 - The legs or the feet need not to be on the same level, but they shall not alternate in relationship to each other.
 - A breaststroke kicking movement is not permitted.
- SW 8.4**
- At each turn and at the finish of the race, the touch shall be made with both hands simultaneously, at, above or below the water surface.
- SW 8.5**
- At the start and at turns, the swimmer is permitted one or more leg kicks and one arm pull under water, which must bring him to the surface.
 - It shall be permissible for a swimmer to be completely submerged for a distance of not more than 15 metres after the start and after each turn.
 - By that point, the head must have broken the surface.
 - The swimmer must remain on the surface until the next turn or finish.

BACKSTROKE SWIMMING

- SW 6.1**
- Prior to the starting signal, the swimmers shall line up in the water facing the starting end, with both hands holding the starting grips.
 - Standing in or on the gutter or bending the toes over the lip of the gutter is prohibited.
- SW 6.2**
- At the signal for starting and after turning the swimmer shall push off and swim upon his back throughout the race except when executing a turn as set forth in SW 6.4.
 - The normal position on the back can include a roll movement of the body up to, but not including 90 degrees from the horizontal.
 - The position of the head is not relevant.
- SW 6.3**
- Some part of the swimmer must break the surface of the water throughout the race.
 - It is permissible for the swimmer to be completely submerged during the turn, at the finish and for a distance of not more than 15 metres after the start and each turn.
 - By that point the head must have broken the surface.
- SW 6.4**
- When executing the turn there must be a touch of the wall with some part of the swimmers body.
 - During the turn the shoulders may be turned over the vertical to the breast after which a continuous single arm pull or a continuous simultaneous double arm pull may be used to initiate the turn.
 - The swimmer must have returned to the position on the back upon leaving the wall.
- SW 6.5**
- Upon the finish of the race the swimmer must touch the wall while on the back.

FREESTYLE SWIMMING

- SW 5.1**
- Freestyle means that in an event so designated the swimmer may swim any style, except that in individual medley or medley relay events, freestyle means any style other than Backstroke, Breaststroke or Butterfly.
- SW 5.2**
- Some part of the swimmer must touch the wall upon completion of each length and at the finish.
- SW 5.3**
- Some part of the swimmer must break the surface of the water throughout the race, except it shall be permissible for the swimmer to be completely submerged for not more than 15 metres after the start and each turn.
 - By that point the head must have broken the surface.

THE START

- SW 4.1**
- The start in Freestyle, Breaststroke, Butterfly and individual medley races shall be with a dive.
 - On the long whistle from the Referee the swimmers shall step onto the starting platform and remain there.
 - On the Starters command "Take your marks" they shall immediately take up a starting position with at least one foot at the front of the starting platform.
 - The position of the hands is not relevant. When all swimmers are stationary, the starter shall give the starting signal.
- SW 4.2**
- The start in Backstroke and Medley Relay races shall be from the water. At the referee's first long whistle the swimmers shall immediately enter the water. At the referees second long whistle the swimmers shall return without undue delay to the starting position (SW 6.1). When all swimmers have assumed their starting positions, the starter shall give the command "take your marks". When all swimmers are stationary, the starter shall give the starting signal
- SW 4.4**
- Any swimmer starting before the starting signal has been given, shall be disqualified.
 - If the starting signal sounds before the disqualification is declared, the race shall continue and the swimmer or swimmers shall be disqualified upon completion of the race.
 - If the disqualification is declared before the starting signal, the signal shall not be given, but the remaining swimmers shall be called back and start again. For these school carnivals the swim meet director can alter this rule to allow either 2 or 3 breaks before declaring a disqualification.
 - **Schools will be afforded a 2 start rule.**

MEDLEY RELAY

- In a Medley team event relay, each team shall consist of four (4) members who shall swim respectively Backstroke, Breaststroke, Butterfly and Freestyle, in that order.

RELAYS

- In all relays the outgoing swimmer cannot leave the starting block until the incoming swimmer has contacted the pool end.
- If a swimmer does leave before the incoming swimmer has contacted the pool end, the team shall be disqualified.

****The Referee will determine the level of leniency in applying the rules.**

PERTH HPC - PARKING

For students being dropped off and collected by parents

- Please ensure that all parents are aware of the locations of the drop off / pick up zone.
- Drop off / pick up zones are strictly 5 minutes only and drivers must remain with the vehicle at all times.
- These are the only areas where drop offs and pickups are to occur.

PARENT DROP OFF / PICK UP ZONE

Located on the left hand side of the Stadium. Turn left at the roundabout and enter into the first entryway on the right.

- At the conclusion of the carnival ALL students must be collected from the drop off / pick up zones.
- Parking attendants will be on duty to direct traffic and we ask that all drivers follow their directions.
- Parents and spectators park in the Perth HPC car park and enter the Stadium through the front entrance.

BUS DROP OFF / PICK UP ZONE

Located on the right-hand side of the Stadium. Turn right at the roundabout and enter into the first entryway, following the loop around to exit via the roundabout.

Buses

- Schools are to make their own bus arrangements.
- The carnivals will commence at –
 - 9.30am sharp for Black & Gold Carnival and Claremont Regional Carnival
 - 10.00am for **Churchlands Network Carnival**
- Arrival no later than 30 - 45 minutes prior to Start time is strongly recommended.
- It is essential that schools provide this information to their bus company/drivers and supervising staff so that the correct procedures are adhered to.
- Buses will enter via Stephenson Ave, through the Perth HPC car park and drop students in Carpark #2 (see **Green** line on map, next page.)
- Students must make their way to the Perth HPC pool entrance (follow **Blue** line on map, next page.)
- Students must be supervised during the entry to the centre.
- Buses will be able to park in Carpark #2.
- All buses are asked to wait in the Carpark #2 area for pick up.
- Traffic wardens will be on duty to direct all buses.

No school groups should enter or exit via the main Perth HPC entrance. Parents may enter this way.
